The second Council of Nicaea restored the use of holy images, which had been suppressed by imperial edict inside the Byzantine Empire according to the argument developed in this poem:

O Logos, to fortify mortals' piety and elicit a clearer knowledge of You, You ruled that the Cross alone would be represented spurning the artificial matter which painted you on walls of old: thus you are shown victorious
